Week 5: Clothing, Household Items, Classifiers, and Larger Numbers

Topics:

1. Classifier B
 - Definition: Classifier B is used to represent thin, flat, or elongated objects (e.g. “table,” “window,” “door”) or movement related to these objects.
 - Examples
 - Sliding a Classifier B handshape to show a door opening/closing
 - Moving Classifier B to indicate placing or removing a flat object (e.g. a tablecloth)
2. Numbers Over 1,000,000
 - Explanation: Build on knowledge from Wk4
 - 1,000,000: Combine the number “1” with the “million” handshape (open palm tapped twice).
 - Larger numbers: Combine digits logically (e.g. 2,500,000).
 - Practice scenarios like population, money, or large-scale counting.
